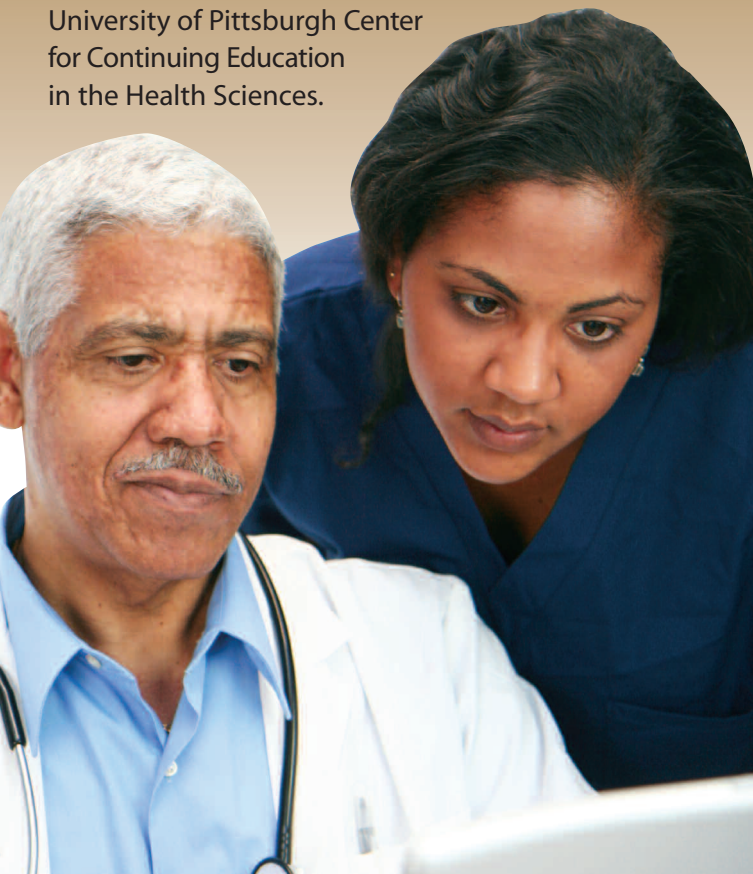

Early Hearing Detection and Intervention



This free on-line CME course uses a case-based format and covers:

- 1) Universal Newborn Hearing Screening and the time line of evaluations
- 2) Primary care of children who do not pass the hearing screen, including:
 - helping families obtain a follow-up rescreening
 - finding an audiologist if the child needs to be referred
 - referring to Early Intervention for children diagnosed with a hearing loss
 - assisting with obtaining funding for hearing aids
 - providing information about hearing loss and parent-to-parent support
- 3) Clinical approach on the basis of family and cultural issues
